

INTRODUCTION TO RESOURCING TASK

Objectives: The title of this session is Resourcing. It will take the whole semester to complete the session. It aims to enhance your search for information about your topic of interest. Some examples the topics are social problems, environmental problems or any topic of interest discussed within the group. You can get information on your topic from books, journals, newspapers, brochures and the internet using any resources e.g. the main library, your department, SALC or even your own home. It also encourages you to share your experience with your classmates via presentation at the end of the session.

Duration: The whole semester

- Steps of Work:**
1. Form a group of 3-4 persons.
 2. Select a topic that all group members are interested in getting more information about.
 3. Set **at least 4 questions** that you want to know about the topic.
 4. Find **at least 3 sources**, (two of which must be different types e.g. textbooks, journals, newspapers, internet, etc.) from which you can get the answers to the questions you have set in number 3.
 5. Collect all the information you can get in a file. Highlight interesting information that tells you about the topic or the answers to your questions. Then write a summary of the information. Do not forget to write a reference of each source.
 6. Write a report of your study and your findings. Also include your working procedures as well as any problems you have faced with any kind of solution (e.g. you could not get the answer to a question, and how you solved the problem.) Your report should reveal what you have learned from this task.
 7. While you are working on your project you can consult your teacher either in or outside class to report about your difficulty or your progress.
 8. Prepare a 15-20 minute oral presentation to share your experience with your classmates. Every member in the group has to take part in the presentation.
